Our Mission

General Information

This summer, Iowa Lakeside Laboratory, the University of Iowa Recreational Services, and the Friends of Lakeside Lab will offer Wildlife Camps for campers ranging in age from those entering 3rd grade to seniors in high school.

Camp Location

The camps will be based at Iowa Lakeside Lab on Lake West Okoboji. Many natural areas will be explored in Iowa Great Lakes region.

Camp Fee

The camp fee is \$140 per camp. The fee includes supervision, materials for activities and a camp t-shirt. A \$50 non-refundable deposit is included in the camp fee and due at the time of registration.

Jane Shuttleworth, Education Coordinator of Iowa Lakeside Laboratory will oversee the camps. She will team with Mary Jane "M.J." Hatfield, Entomologist, to teach Bug Camp and Insect Academy, and join the University of Iowa Wildlife Camps' staff in leading Dragonfly and Grasshopper Camps. Bug Camp (July 13 - 17)

These are some of the questions we will explore at camp. We will learn techniques & tools for catching, observing and rearing insects from a variety of habitats. Other activities include swimming, canoeing, and maybe even insect-eating! **(For youth entering 4th-7th grades)**

Insect Academy (July 13 - 17)



Want to go a step farther into the world of insects and other creatures? Interested in learning what it takes to be an insect scientist or entomologist? Then perhaps INSECT ACADEMY is for you! We will learn more about how to identify bugs and begin a study of the bugs that live on and around the campus. Other fun activities will be provided throughout the week to keep us from getting bugged out! **(For youth entering 8th-12th grades)**

Dragonfly Camp (August 3 - 7)



Want to learn more about the wildlife found in and around the waters of our region? Come join us as we explore Lake Okoboji and local wetlands and discover the diversity of wildlife that inhabit these ecosystems. Activities will also include bird-banding, canoeing, swimming, fishing, Bald Eagle observations, and more. **(For youth entering 3rd-7th grades)**

Grasshopper Camp (August 10 - 14)



If you are fascinated with the woodlands and grasslands and all the creatures that inhabit these ecosystems, then this is the camp for you! Come join us as we learn about the creatures of these areas with activities including Red-tailed Hawk and American Kestrel observations, bird-banding, insect explorations, along with canoeing, swimming, and other fun activities. **(For youth entering 3rd-7th grades)**

A. Release Form

Medical Authorization / Release Form

I, _____ (parent or legal guardian's name), as parent or legal guardian of _____ (child's name) in consideration of the Recreational Services and Iowa Lakeside Laboratory of the University of Iowa granting the child permission to participate in Wildlife Camps hereby assume all risk of personal injury (including death) which may result from any Wildlife Camp activity including transportation-related accidents; and acting for the child, myself, our heirs, personal representatives and assigns do hereby release the University of Iowa, its Board of Regents, individually and collectively, Recreational Services, Iowa Lakeside Laboratory, members of the University faculty, administrative officers, all other agents, representatives and employees of the said university, all instructors and all participants of said Wildlife Camp program from all liability, including claims and suits at law or in equity, for injury fatal or otherwise, which may result from the child taking part in wildlife camp activities, unless such injury is a direct result of the negligence of the University of Iowa or that of its employees.

A \$50 non-refundable deposit per session per child is required. Make checks payable to The University of Iowa. **The \$50 non-refundable deposit (credited as a part of the camp fee) or the entire fee must accompany your application.**
